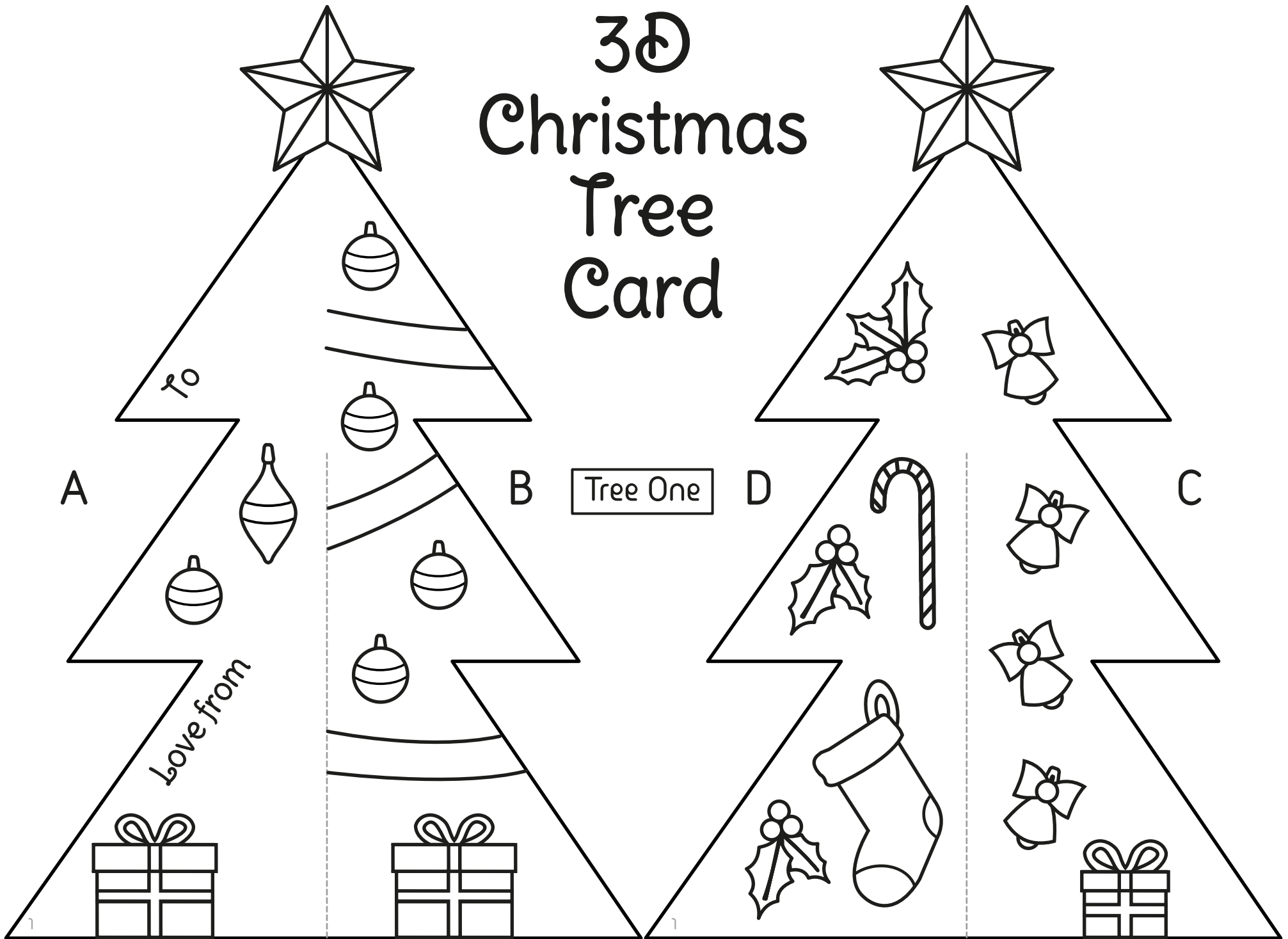


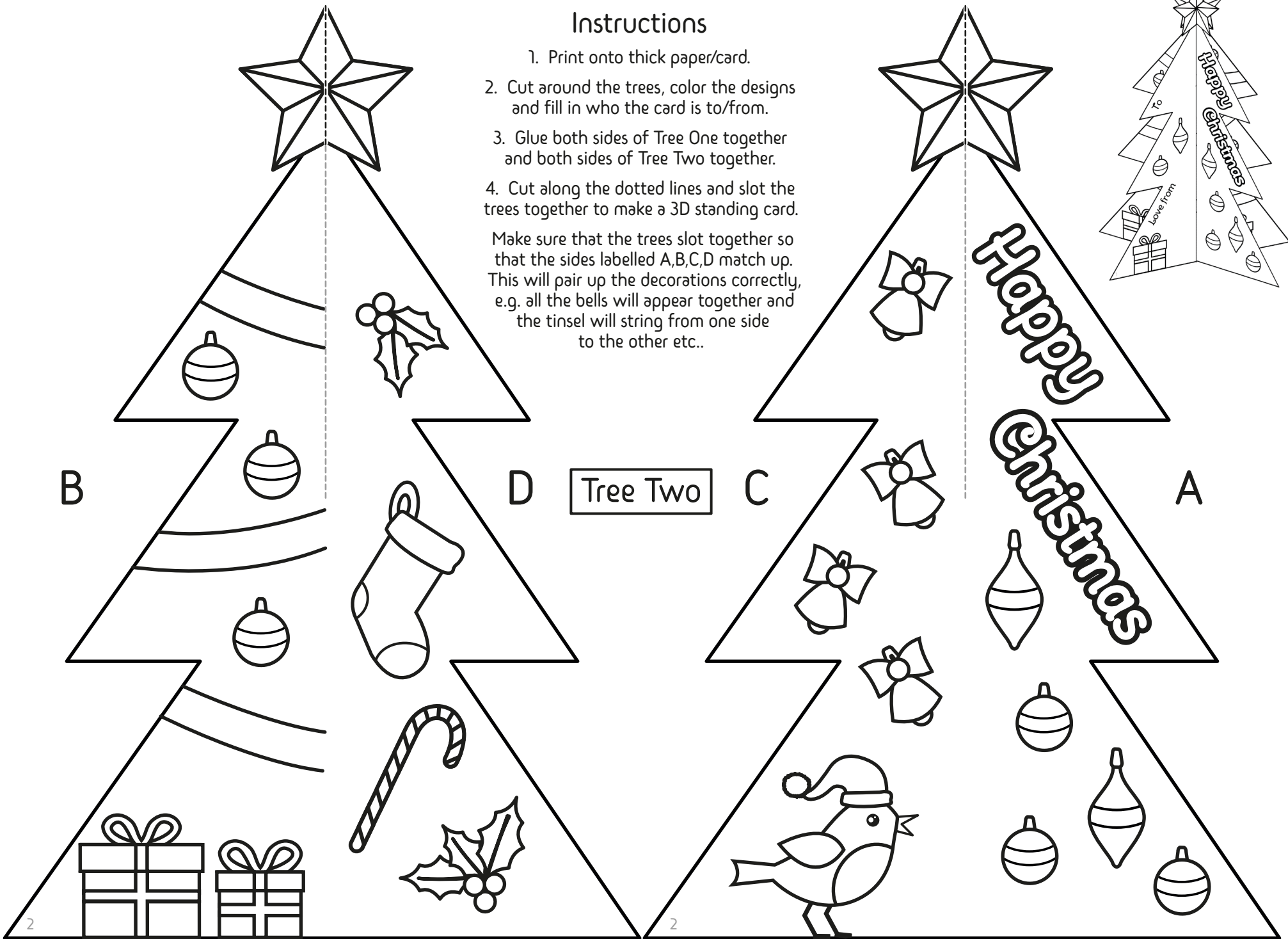
3D Christmas Tree Card

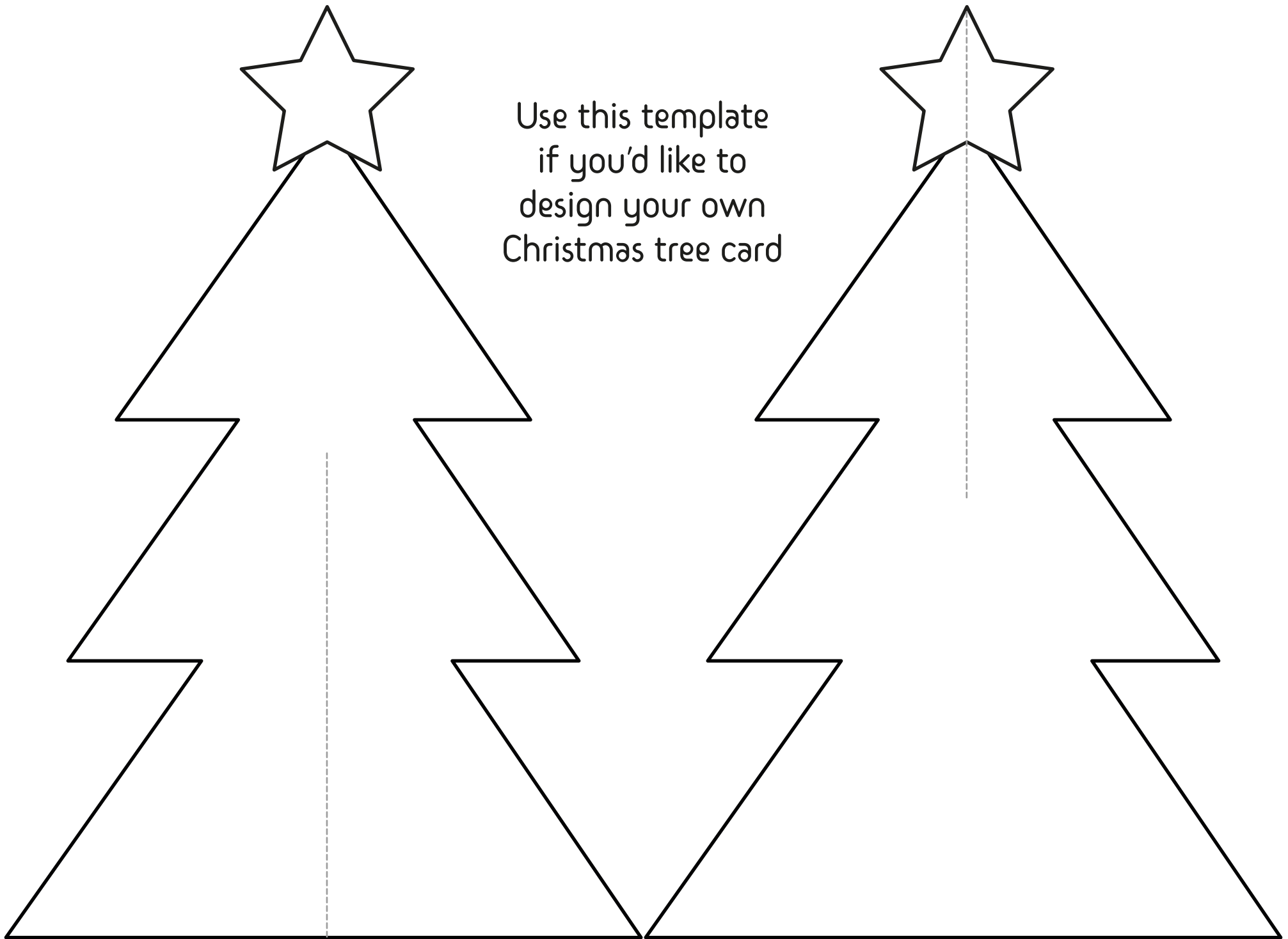


Instructions

1. Print onto thick paper/card.
2. Cut around the trees, color the designs and fill in who the card is to/from.
3. Glue both sides of Tree One together and both sides of Tree Two together.
4. Cut along the dotted lines and slot the trees together to make a 3D standing card.

Make sure that the trees slot together so that the sides labelled A,B,C,D match up. This will pair up the decorations correctly, e.g. all the bells will appear together and the tinsel will string from one side to the other etc..

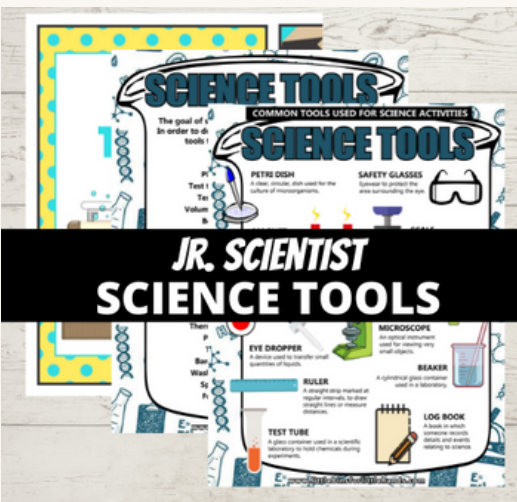
