
## cirrocumulus

high clouds that look fluffy, like cotton balls




#### cirrus

high clouds that look wispy & thin, and appear during good weather




## altostratus

middle clouds that look flat & gray, and are usually a sign of rain




# altocumulus

## cumulus

low to middle clouds that look like large, fluffy cotton balls



## stratocumulus

low clouds that look fluffy & gray, and may be a sign a rain




## stratus

## cumulonimbus

very tall clouds that span low to high, a sign of thunderstorms

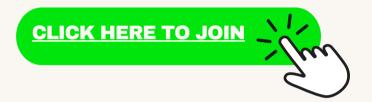

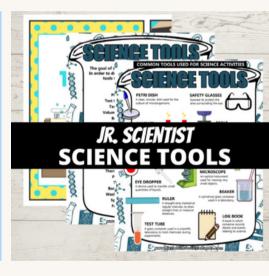
