INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1: Print the template of shamrocks.

STEP 2: With the paint and the tools, paint your shamrocks using the pointillism technique.

STEP 3: Once dry, cut them out and glue to a background card stock.

STEP 4: Color and cut out your St Patrick's Day heading.

STEP 5: Glue your designs to the card stock.

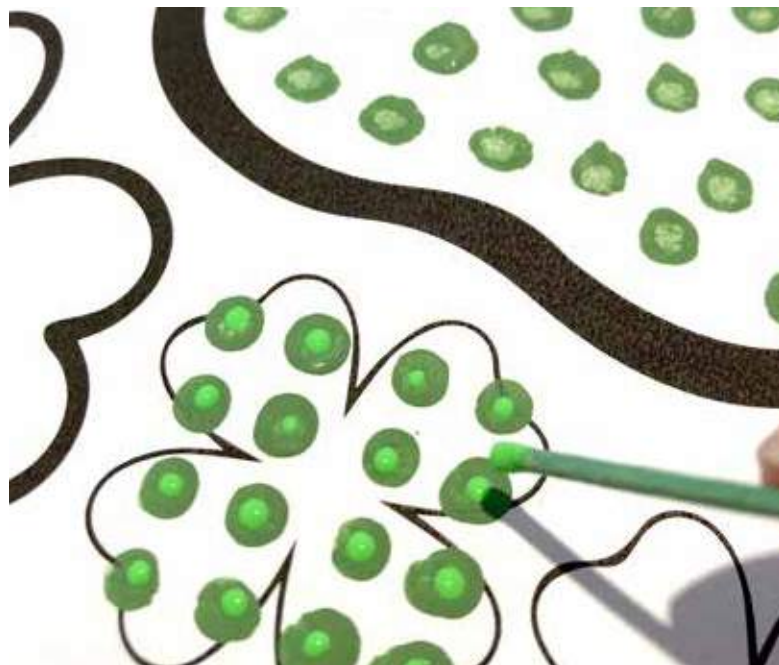
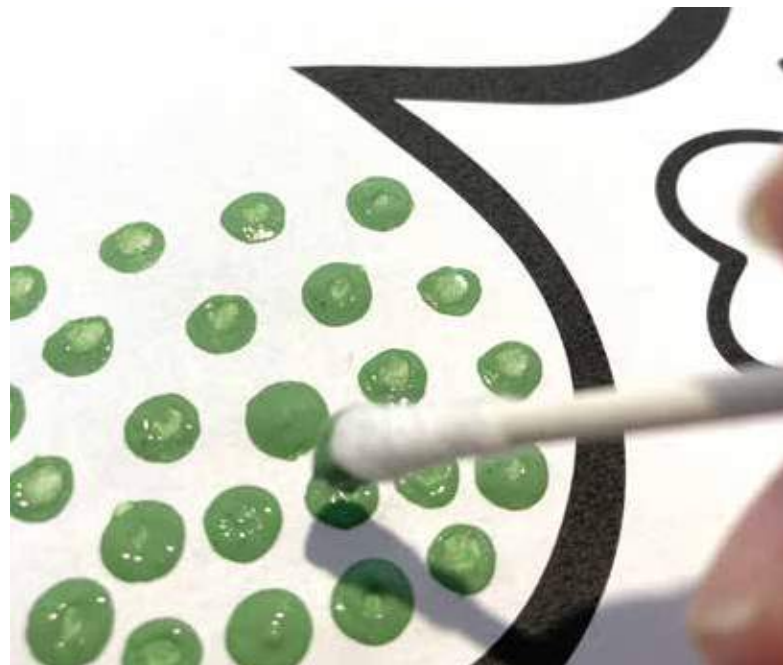

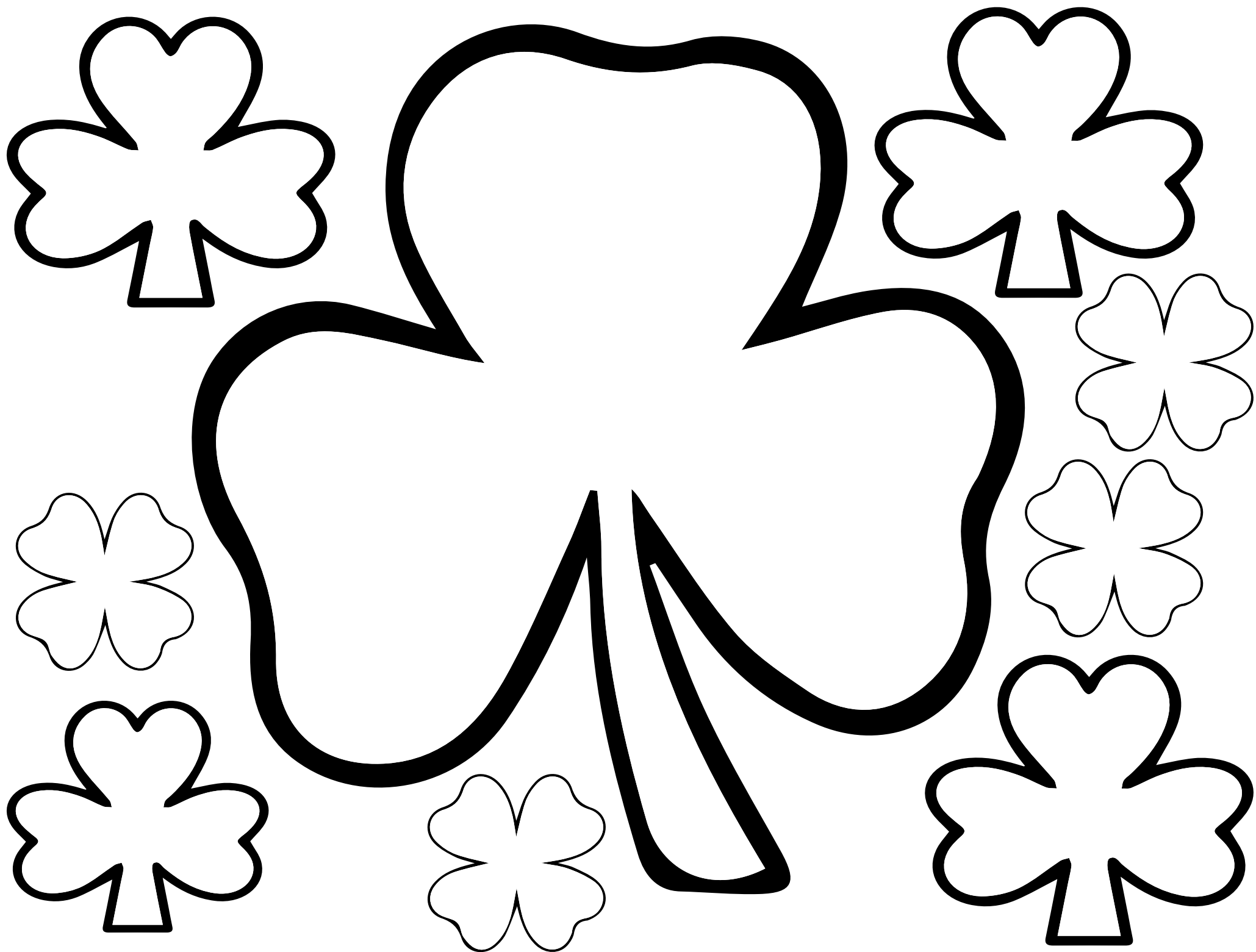

POINTILLISM AND GEORGES SEURAT

Georges Seurat was born in 1859 in Paris. Georges found that, instead of mixing the colors of paint on a palette, he could paint tiny dots of different colors next to each other on the canvas and the eye would mix the colors. He called this way of painting Divisionism. Today we call it Pointillism.

His paintings worked like computer monitors work today. His dots were like the pixels on a computer screen. During his career, Seurat showed a strong interest in the intellectual and scientific methods of art.
